167 RSVP Volunteers Fight Hunger

Hunger can affect every aspect of one's existence. One in every 10 seniors and one in every six children feel insecure about their prospects for regular meals, according to the Colorado Health Foundation's January 2018

Colorado Blueprint 5 Year Plan to End Hunger. The report states that based on the rising cost of housing, utilities, etc., nutritional food can be beyond the means of these people.



RSVP volunteers through 10 non-profit organizations, the fight is on to address hunger in our own community! RSVP volunteers feed hungry people by packing food boxes, distributing food at food banks and pantries, cooking and serving meals to the hungry, driving seniors to the grocery store, and taking meals to homebound elderly (even on Christmas Eve!).

For several years, School District 51 and Western Colorado Community Foundation have run the Lunch Lizard Program, which provides meals to hungry children during the summer. Last year, 25,000 meals were served at 17 different sites. The trucks are manned by paid staff and RSVP and community volunteers.

RSVP Charter Member Leaves Legacy of Volunteering

RSVP had its humble beginnings 45 years ago in Mesa County. Winnie Krantwashl, Colorado native and resident of Grand Junction, was a charter member of RSVP until her death in 2005. She considered RSVP to be the leading edge of service organizations.

Winnie's service through RSVP to our community matched her skill for writing. For 27 years, she wrote weekly columns for the Palisade Tribune newspaper. She also was published in the Fruita Times, the Daily Sentinel, the Senior Beacon, and the Montrose Tribune.

After retiring from the State Home and Training School, where Winnie won the Outstanding Woman of Colorado for Women at Work Award, she won over 100 gold medals in Senior Games race walking. Winnie was also involved in politics and church. Winnie served as a shining example of what one woman can accomplish and has impacted others by volunteering to write.

Winnie left her legacy, as her daughter, Peggy Ballard, continues to serve our community as a RSVP volunteer. When Peggy moved back to the local area in 1998, Winnie advised her to "first, join RSVP". Peggy has contributed almost 1,500 hours doing one-time projects and events. These allow her to continue to volunteer even though she travels frequently. Winnie's legacy endures generations.
